Founder's Statement

2022 commenced officially for us at SAF after the first board meeting of the year and following the proceedings of the meeting, our corporate goal for the year was "to build corporate relationships with other organizations and government parastatals to facilitate future partnerships and to build credibility".

Sequel to this, we paid courtesy visits to different government and corporate institutions whose vision and objectives are in alignment with what we do in SAF.

With respect to our core vision and mission as an organization we raised some money from donors to help 5 girls who couldn't afford to pay their SSCE fees. These girls were automatically enrolled into the Girl Adoption Project which meant they would immediately start a one-year free skills

acquisition and 6 months One-on-one mentorship with our trained mentors after writing their exams. These girls are the pioneer beneficiaries of this project and while we are taking cognizance of some of the gaps and adjustments we need to make in the subsequent cohorts, we are also monitoring the progress and impact of this project on the current beneficiaries.

In 2022, we went on a school-to-school campaign to sensitive teenage boys in commemoration of the international day for the boy child and we reached about 500 teenage boys. Our primary beneficiary is the girl child, however since both boys and girls coexist in the same environment and in some cases, under the same roof, it is vital that the boys are also made to understand their roles and moral responsibilities in order to be a reliable support for every girl child around them.

Our goal as an organization is to help the girl child harness and explore their full potential, regardless of the financial, socio-cultural, religious and even intrapersonal limitations. We just want to see girls grow into thriving successful women, doing what they love and living life to the fullest.

This is the motivation that spurs everything we do in SAF.

Hence in 2022, to commemorate the international day for women we launched a monthly online mentorship for women and girls who may not reside in our focus community but may need help navigating through different life challenges; we have been able to reach 450 women (and men) so far.

We also marked the international day for the girl child in October 2022 with a 3 days sensitization/advocacy campaign to promote girl child education and empowerment in Abakaliki. The campaign featured a school to school outreach sensitizing girls about different opportunities they can leverage in tech; a convention of community and state leaders in Abakaliki to address the challenges and plight of the girlchild; and an open market rally calling on parents and guardians of girls to give support and encouragement to their female wards to ensure they get educated.

All these projects could not have been possible without the generous support of the most dedicated team in the world, the SAF executive team; our esteemed board members, all our gracious donors, partners, mentors and volunteers. Giving their most precious resources, time and skills to ensure the actualization of all our set mission and goals.

We are all God's vessels of honor and it is an utmost privilege to serve. Thank you for saying yes to this call.



Impact Report on projects

Sister's Ally Foundation made a lot of impacts in 2022. Board of trustees, the executive team and the volunteers of the the organisation worked tirelessly to reach girls in different communities. See the details below.

Projects	Details	Outcome
School-to-school Sensitization	The SAF team visited 3 schools for outreach and sensitization.	3 schools visited, spoke to
Girl Adoption Project (GAP)	This project involves providing educational funding for girls by paying for their SSCE fees and a full university scholarship.	
Skills	This is a project that equips young girls with skills like fashion designing, digital skills, farming and catering.	5 beneficiaries. 2 are done, 3 are still in progress. One of the beneficiaries learning fashion designing with Rehaire won the designer of the year
Online Mentorship	The SAF online mentorship commenced in March 2022. The project is aimed at reaching young women and men online; outside our beneficiary communities.	Reached 450 people.
One-on-one Mentorship	SAF organised this 6 months mentorship to create a mindset shift and equip girls with leadership skills. Each beneficiary had a mentor assigned to her.	Paired 5 mentors with 7 mentees

Projects	Details	Outcome
Boys outreach	The SAF team visited 2 boys secondary school for sensitization. (Nnodo Boys and Boys Technical college)	2 schools visited, spoke to 500 boys
Market rally	This was amongst the series of activities to mark the International Day of the Girl Child. The Team with some volunteers visited two local markets to sensitization of traders on the importance of education for females.	Visited 2 local markets in Abakaliki, and reached over 1200 people.
Convention	A convention was held with Abakaliki Community leaders to address the plight of young girls and women in the LGA. It was to mark the IDGC.	3 community Kings, 6 schools, 40 community Representatives, and 9 organizations.

- 5.SAF visited the Office of the Commissioner for Women affairs and Social Development, Ebonyi State to interact with them and get their support in handling women-related issues in the state.




